I will be able to ask consent before taking a photograph using a tablet.

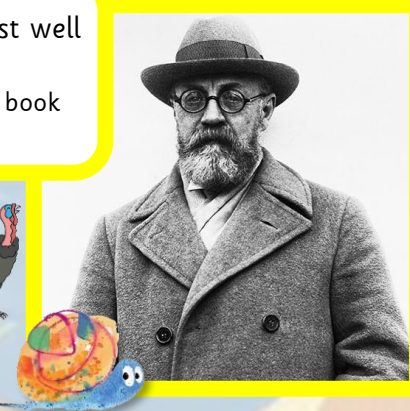

This is **Henri Matisse**, a French visual artist well known for his experimental paintings. We will learn about some of his art through the book 'Matisse's Magical Trail'.

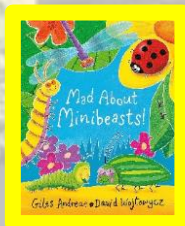
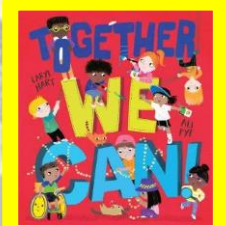
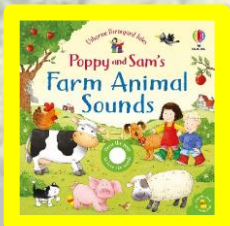


Inspired by our key text, we will be finding out more about life on the farm and what it takes to look after animals. Then we will compare that to how we look after ourselves!
