Seasons – As the year passes there are regular changes in the weather. This cycle of change is divided into four parts, which are called seasons.

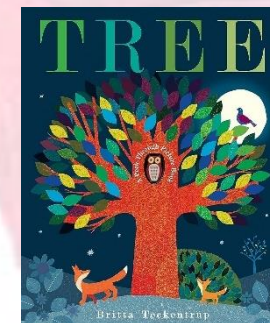
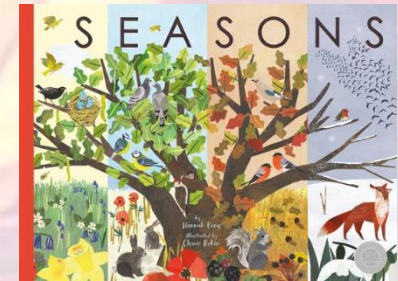
Weather – The weather is the way the air and atmosphere feel. It includes the outside temperature, strength of the wind and if it is raining, cloudy, sunny, hailing, snowing or foggy.

Year – A period of time that is 365 days long, unless it is a leap year. It is the time taken for the Earth to orbit the Sun once.

Month – A year is divided into 12 parts that we call months and each month is unique.

Day – Measures the time of daytime and night-time. There are 24 hours in a day.
